Editorial

What a pity on the part of the education scenario all over the country. The U.G.C. at the beck and call of the ruling govt. is making an all out effort to destroy the harmony and rhythm of the education sector as a whole. From K.G. to P.G. and especially breaking the year long tested system of education deliberately. The new emphasis is to convert an institution into multydisciplinary system. The existing system of education is inadequate in respect of infrastructure facilities and disproportionate students-teacher ratio. Under this tremendous pressure on education, the implementation of NEP 2020 will further jeopardise it and will also breaking the morals of the starkeholders of system.

In view of all this malfunctions in higher education system, AIFUCTO has submitted a letter to the chairman of U.G.C. on 12. 09. 2022 stating the difficulties faced by teachers in terms of Ph. D., M.Phil, sabbatical leave, uniformity of age of superannuation in the states. It also highlighted the need to refrain from implementing the regressive recommendation of the NEP 2020.

After we meet at Amritsar on 24th April. 2022, the JFME organised a Massive Protest Movement to Parliament on 3rd August, 2022. Many national leaders of political parties, Members of parliament, National leaders of AIFUCTO, retired teachers organisation AIFRUCTO, student wings of various national parties, human right organisations attended and spoke on the issue. It was a great success. The members of AIFUCTO in neighbouring states deserve special congratualations for their all out effort.

On 31st August, 2022 the NEC meet at Chennai, on the campus of alumni, Anna University, and a unanimous resolution was taken against the undemocratic and stubborn attitude of Ministry of Education and U.G.C.. The meeting also decided to call for a massive struggle for the interest of education and to protect the next generation as a whole.

On 5th September, 2022 the members of the teaching community, working and retired in unison consolidated protests in all states against the anarchy, misleading targets and oppression against the teaching community by rendering law against their right to speak. Friends the time has come when we have to remain united against the unholy allaince of private money sharks and the ruling govt. both in centre and states to dismantle the Citadel of education system—where the relationship of student—teacher is in purest form. We will stick to offline and will not succumb to online or ghost education.

The Task Ahead

Each and every century has got some special features and incidents. Likewise when the present century will be retraced in future, among many other features and specialties, definitely the outbreak of "Covid 19" pandemic will be a major one. It is needless to reiterate here how severely human life and livelihoods were affected by Covid. In a nutshell it can be said that Covid had its effects in every sphere of life. Education sector was no exception. Almost two long years schools and colleges in the country was closed. Early this year educational institutions started reopening. But during those two years of closure of the educational institutions there has been sea change in the field of higher education of the country. Becoming compatible with these changes is the Major challenge before the entire community of the country.

Development of human civilization is taking place everyday. Also there is continuous progress and advancement of science and technology all over the world. Naturally regular updating of knowledge is utmost necessity. Obviously the course structure, syllabus have to be updated accordingly. It is well understood that introduction of new education policies at regular intervals of time is the need of the hour.

It is expected that whenever new education policy will be framed, it will ensure the holistic development of the country because "education is a weapon for social change", Access, equity and quality are the three yardsticks to judge any education system. AIFUCTO since its inception has demanded "education for all", inclusive and quality education. But unfortunately NEP 2020, as we see it, unable to address any of our long standing demands. Discussing NEP 2020 is not the objective of this article. On the contrary in the remaining section of the article the challenges which have been initiated due to introduction of NEP 2020 will be briefly discussed.

NEP 2020 is totally silent about the achievement and failures of the last National Policy on Education. It was expected that NEP 2020 will assess the new challenges that have emerged in the intervening years, and articulate a vision that can robustly connect ground realities and democratic aspiration to constitutional directives in this key area of nation building. But these things remain unaddressed in NEP 2020. NEP 2020 was announced in July 2020 during peak pandemic period. Since then it is being implemented in unnecessary hasty manner. But as it is found after reopening of the educational institutions, there is large number

of drop outs almost in all courses. Bringing those drop-out students in the main -stream of education is the biggest challenge before the society at present. But the UGC is busy with hasty implementation of NEP 2020, drop out is no concern of either the Government or the U.G.C. As a responsible Teachers' organization we have to accept this challenge and try to bring back the drop-out students to the classes.

Use of teaching aids facilitates teaching, provides better way of communicating to the students. But when and which aid is to be used, that will be decided by the teacher, and must not be used mechanically. Similarly in some situation 'Online' mode of teaching can be helpful. But 'Online' mode of teaching can not be the main mode of teaching. For a special lecture by an eminent academician staying abroad, 'Online' mode is welcome but it can not be the regular practice. We strongly believe that 'Online' mode of teaching can be complementary to the conventional mode of teaching, but can never be the substitute of it. Similarly listening to some recorded lectures can not be equivalent to the live class room lectures. But without accepting a single suggestion from the Teachers' organizations 'Blended learning 'mode has been introduced. Introduction of 'Online' mode of teaching will make the entry of the corporates in the field of education easy and this is the ultimate motive. Undoing such moves of U.G.C., is another big challenge in front of us.

The problem of drop out students have already been mentioned. But U.G.C. in its move to implement 'ABC (Academic Bank of Credit)' system has legalized the dropping out of students. In fact this scheme will provoke the students to leave their studies before completion. In a country where Ph.D holders remain unemployed, it is next to impossible that a student not completing his/her degree will be well -placed just with a diploma. AIFUCTO submitted its objection on this issue also to U.G.C. but in vain.

Similarly, according to the guideline of NEP 2020 'CUET' has been introduced from this year. This is a glaring example of centralization of higher education of the country. Almost every steps taken by U.G.C. under the directives of Union Govt. is undemocratic, antiteaching and anti-teacher. So we have to build country -wide movements against such undemocratic moves. We have to arouse our colleagues, make them understand the threats and dangers so that they turn up in large numbers in the next sit -in program of AIFUCTO in front of UGC office at New Delhi. Let that be the beginning of our movement against the attacks on higher education in India. Long live AIFUCTO.

Dear Friends,

Warm Greetings and Best Wishes.

AIFUCTO, no sooner the menace of Corona Epidemic receded, dedicated itself to rejuvenate the organization. The twin challenges before AIFUCTO is to resist the undemocratic and unilateral implementation of NEP 2020 with disastrous consequences as well as to redress the professional problems of college and University teachers across the country. The historic city of Amritsar witness two days deliberation on $23^{rd} - 24^{th}$ April 2022 to have brain storming session on NEP 2020 and the National Executive Body Meeting. The successful completion of Amritsar conclave provided new direction of AIFUCTO to make it vibrant and meaningful.

Seminar on NEP 2020:

In the background of adamant attitude of Central Govt. to discuss with the stake holders on implementation of NEP 2020, PCCTU organized on seminar on 23rd April in the auditorium of DAV College, Amritsar, affiliated to Gruru Nanak Dev University. The theme of the seminar was "NEP- 2020". Kunwar Vijaya Pratap Singh, MLA AAP was the Chief Guest and Key-note address on the theme was delivered by Dr. Yoga Singh of Punjab University, Patiala. The distinguished personalities who took part in the seminar were Dr. TS. Bonipal, Dean College of Development Council, Dr. Vinaya Sofat, President PCCTU, Prof. SS Randhwa, General Secretary PCCTU, Dr. Rajanish Kumar, Principal DAV College, Amritsar, Prof. HS. Wallia, former leader PCCTU and Prof. HS Pawan, AIFRUCTO, Prof. Dr. Kesab Bhattacharya, President AIFUCTO and Prof. Dr. Arun Kumar, General Secretary, AIFUCTO. The erudite scholars on the dias vividly presented an in-depth analysis of NEP

2020. Dr. Raminder Singh presided over the meeting. In the post lunch session many scholars including PCCTU and AIFUCTO leadership presented research best papers on NEP 2020. Prof. Brahma Ved Sharma coordinated the proceeding the seminar. The overall views express in the one daylong seminar was that NEP 2020 has to be relooked and to be made more scientific, democratic and inclusive. The seminar also overwhelmingly supported the view of AIFUCTO leadership for a country wide united movement to protest and expos the NEP 2020. In the seminar there was also unanimous concern for immediate implementation of revised 7th UGC scales of pay for Punjab College and University Teachers. The first day long program ended with the visit of NEC members of AIFUCTO and all other leadership to historic site of Jalianwalawag and Golden Temple of Amritsar. The temple management extended the warm reception and felicitation to all leadership which is memorable for all of us.

National Executive Body Meeting: 24th April 2022.

The NEC of AIFUCTO was held in the premises of DAV College, Amritsar on 24th April 2022. The secretariat of AIFUCTO met at 9 AM to prepare the blue print of AIFUCTO NEC. Prof. Dr. Kesab Bhattacharya, President AIFUCTO presided over the meeting and gave a brief introductory observation on the task before AIFUCTO. Prof. Dr. Arun Kumar, General Secretary elaborated exhaustively the challenges before AIFUCTO, i.e. undemocratic attitude of Central Govt. in resolving professional problems and obstinate behavior of the Central Govt. to impose an undemocratic, unscientific, retrograde and exclusionary NEP on the collective wisdom of the nation. The General Secretary also expresses concern about the inordinate delay by the Govt. of Punjab to implement revised 7th UGC scales of pay for the teachers of Punjab. General Secretary also threatened the Govt. of Punjab to resolve the issue immediately failing which AIFUCTO will take it as a core demand for all India protest.

Members of NEC including National Secretaries, Vice-Presidents, Zonal Office bearers had a serious discussion on various issues and after threadbare debate and discussion resolved the following:

Service matters of University and college teachers.

Resolved to fight continuously and consistently on all important issues like extension of RC/OC for CAS, relaxation of Ph.D., criteria for appointment and promotion, Uniform age of retirement to 65 across the country, filling up permanently all vacant teaching post and mobilize for dignified service condition for lakhs of adhoc/temporary/Block grant/Guest faculty / Vidiya Sambal Teaches across the country.

Resolved to support the demand of Punjab and University and college teachers for revised UGC scales of pay. NEC also appealed to the newly elected Govt. of Punjab to implement the revised UGC scales of pay without any further delay.

Movement Programme:

- AIFUCTO NEC resolve to organize a massive protest program before Parliament / UGC during the monsoon session to high light our professional issues including our opposition to NEP 2020. The date will be decided and communicated very soon to all after consultation with the secretariat.
- All affiliates of AIFUCTO are requested to carry on intensive campaigning program exposing the dark aspect of NEP 2020 at state level and also university level.
- All affiliates are requested to send E-mail and telegram to the Chief Minister of Punjab for immediate implementation of revised 7th UGC scales of pay for Punjab University and College Teachers.

Organization issues:

NEC expressed displeasure that many of the affiliates are not organizing their statutory conference in due time and not electing new office bearers. AIFUCTO request all such states federation / University association to complete their democratic process before the academic conference of AIFUCTO proposed to be held by the end of November, 2022. AIFUCTO will seriously consider disaffiliating them if they do not respect the democratic wish of the NEC.

> Constitutional amendment :

AIFUCTO NEC approved the report of the constitution amendment committee. The General Council held at Tirupathi has already given green signal for the purpose. The new amendment includes the increase of the post National Secretary from 5 to 7, Vice-President, 9 to 12 in each category one post for women activist will be reserved. There will also increase of zone from 8 to 10. Only working teachers can file nomination for election to the any office of AIFUCTO.

> Affiliation issues :

AIFUCTO NEC granted affiliation to Federation of Affiliated Degree college Teaching and Non-Teaching employees of Bihar (FACTNEB) after presentation by Prof. Sambunath PrasadSinha and Prof. Arun Gautam from the side of FACTNEB, the NEC accorded affiliation.

Committee for Alternative Education Policy Document:

NEC resolved to constitute a committee for preparation of an Alternative Education Policy Document. Dr. D. Kumar, Treasure AIFUCTO will be the convener, other members of the committee are Prof. C. Padmanavan, former National Secretary AIFUCTO, Prof. Nagrajan and Prof. Binayak Bhatacharya (both National Secretary) and Prof. Sunetra Mitra. It has been resolved that the committee will prepare the document within three months after which the document will be placed before NEC for endorsement. Further all office bearers and NEC members are requested to send suggestions and views to the committee as soon as possible. We are glade to intimate you that the newly constituted committee held its first meeting at Amritsar on 24th April 2022 and took the following decisions.

- Prof. Kulkarni of MFUCTO was co-opted as the member of the committee.
- Views of all NEC members / All affiliates / Independent Think Tank / Intellectuals / Social Groups / Other stake holders are invited for the document.
- Prof. Lokendra Singh, National Secretary is requested to collect address, E-mail,
 Whatsap no. of all NEC members / other stake holder in a proper format.
- Design of proper Google form to seek opinion of all stake holders on alternative education policy documents be prepared.

Teachers Movement :

Resolved to continue quarterly on-line publication of Teachers Movement. The editorial board is reconstituted with Prof. K.K. Theckdutta and Prof. Mrinmoy Bhatacharya as patron. All members of AIFUCTO Secretariat have been included as members of editorial Board. NEC further requested all members and leaders to contribute article and write-up for enriching the quality content of Teachers Movement.

Logo of AIFUCTO:

Resolved to prepare a logo for AIFUCTO. Prof. J. Gandhiraj and Prof. V. Ravi (both Vice-President) were authorized to design logo to be adopted in the next NEC.

Address of NEC Member:

All affiliates and its leaders are requested to send their latest mail-ID to the General Secretary for speedy communication.

Gratitude to Leaders and Activist of PUCCTU:

NEC expressed heartfelt thank to all leaders and activist of PUCCTU including Prof. S S Randhawa and Prof. Binay Sofat (President and General Secretary) for cordiality, hospitality and for their sincere attention to make the AIFUCTO at Amritsar a grand success. AIFUCTO also express its pleasure for the felicitation extended to all NEC members by

offering of shawls, buke and memento's by the organizers.

Dear Friends, Warm Greetings and Best Wishes.

In a difficult and tough time for our country and AIFUCTO, the Secretariat met on 20th June to carry forward the decision of National Executive held at Amritsar. We are extremely concerned to inform you all that the Ministry of Education and UGC did not respond properly to resolve the burning issues of the teachers through democratic dialogue and discussion. Ministry of Education without caring our considered views on NEP 2020 is proceeding undemocratically and hastily to implement most of the retrograde provisions of NEP which will have wider negative implications in the sphere of education in general and higher education in particular. In spite of our repeated requests to the Ministry of Education and Punjab Government, revised UGC scales of Seventh Pay is yet to be implemented in the state. The Ministry of Education, Government of India appears to be obstinate, undemocratic and callous in resolving our pending issues. In this background of dismal scenario, the Secretariat of AIFUCTO met on 20th June 2022 through google meet and unanimously resolved the followings;

- As resolved in the NEC, held at DAV College, Amritsar on 24th April 2022, the Secretariat decided to organize a Massive Protest Movement on 3rd August 2022 at New Delhi before the monsoon sessions of Parliament. The Protest Movement will focus on our resentment against NEP as well as burning issues of the teachers of the country.
- AIFUCTO Secretariat members will proceed to New Delhi during 14th to 16th July to submit memorandum to the Minister of Education and the Chairman UGC on our long pending issues.
- AIFUCTO Secretariat has also resolved to request the constituents of JFME to participate in the program of AIFUCTO and to have a united Protest Movement on3rd August focusing our long resentment against NEP.
- A formal meeting of JFME for wider consultation and consensus will be convened during 14th – 16th July in Delhi.
- The Secretariat of AIFUCTO expressed serious concern on nonimplementation of Seventh Revised UGC scales of pay in the state of Punjab and Himachal Pradesh. General Secretary of AIFUCTO has sent

a representation to Sri Arvind Kejriwal, National Convenor of APP for kind intervention.

6. On Agnivir Appointment:

AIFUCTO expresses serious concern on the new procedure of contractual appointments in the armed forces. The procedure is neither in the interest of the youth so appointed nor in the general interest of armed forces. AIFUCTO while not appreciating the violent nature of protest, appeals to Government of India to respond democratically to the concern of the youth of the country.

Friends, AIFUCTO feels that the days of our prayers, petition and submission is over. AIFUCTO has to be more vocal and aggressive to realize the desired goal. The only respond to the present challenges is a united movement of all the stake holders to Save Education, Save Campus and Save Nation. The proposed protest movement on 3rd August 2022 is in the same direction. Educate, Organize and agitate and take all efforts to make successful the 3rAugust Programme.

Long Live AIFUCTO and Long Live Teachers Movement. Fraternally Yours

Warm Greetings and Best Wishes.

The Tirupati Statutory Conference has decided the agenda as well as programme of action of AIFUCTO. Accordingly, we proceeded to carry on our determined and convinced struggle against NEP 2020. We wrote several letters for a democratic dialogue with Minister of Education, Govt. of India on NEP, besides focusing on our pending profession issues. AIFUCTO also drew the attention of UGC and requested for a discussion on educational problems as well as our genuine long pending service matters. AIFUCTO along with JFME organized a massive impressive protest Dharana Programme before the parliament on 3rd August 2022 and express our genuine concern and resentment against undemocratic, unscientific and exclusionary nature of NEP. Central Govt. behaved like a dumb- deaf and exhibited unpardonable negligence for democratic values. In this unprecedented situation AIFUCTO National Executive Body met in the Alumni Campus Centre, Anna University, Chennai on 31st August 2022. Responding to the prevailing dismal national situation, AIFUCTO NEC responded strongly against lethargic, undemocratic and stubborn attitude of Ministry of Education and UGC, decided for a bitter and sustained struggle in the larger interest of the nation.

Meeting of NEC:

The meeting of NEC was held in the Alumni Campus Centre, Anna University, Chennai on 31st August 2022. It was nicely organize with cordiality and personal touch by the dedicated members of JAC of College Teachers of Tamilnadu. Prof. Keshab Bhatacharya, President AIFUCTO presided over the meeting. In his brief enlightened introductory remark he exposed the inner contradiction and dangerous implication of NEP including the recent UGC guidelines on Professors of practice. General Secretary Dr. Arun Kumar gave exhaustive details of AIFUCTO activities, expressed anguish and anger on undemocratic attitude of Ministry of

education and UGC, expressed serious concern of Govt. of India not addressing the long pending issues of university and college teachers as well as implementing the negative features of NEP 2020 without responding to our democratic views. He expressed thanks to the members of the states namely Punjab, Bihar, Bengal, Kerala, UP, Haryana for a larger participation in the 3rd August Dharana Programme at New Delhi. Dharana Programme was impressive and a grand success. It inspired confidence to move forward, said General Secretary. General Secretary also requested the affiliates of Kerala, West Bengal and Madhya Pradesh to explore the possibility of holding the academic conference in the month of Nov-Dec 2022. The members of AIFUCTO NEC deliberated and had serious discussion on various profession problems and the negative aspects of NEP. After serious pondering on issues and brain storming discussion, the following decision were taken in the NEC.

The Movement Resolution :-

- The NEC has decided to organize 3 days Dharana Programme before UGC office at New Delhi highlighting our professional and long pending demands including our serious objection against NEP. There will protest across the nation through convention / protest / Dharana / Seminars and other form of movements as decided at the state level to strengthen the cause of AIFUCTO. The details of Dharana programme and the mechanism of co-ordination will be decided very soon through a virtual meeting of office bearers. Steps will be taken to have a co-ordinate movement along with JFME for a bigger united struggle.
- State level convention and protest will continue across the country for withdraw of NEP.
- Broader co-ordination with the JFME will be made for broader struggle keeping in line also with the decision of JFME for a country wide protest movement from the 5th September, the Guru Divas.

Service Matters :

- The issue of extension of RC/OC, Ph.D increment and completion of Ph.D for promotion and professor of practice were discussed thoroughly and it has been decided that the issues will be settled only through movement and struggle. The executive decided to oppose the concept of Professor of practice as a dangerous for the future of University system and it has to opposed tooth and nail.

- The NEC Approved the proposal for life membership of Dr. A.PASLITHIL (FUTA Kerala). His life membership shall be enforced as and he deposited the payable fee to AIFUCTO
- A book published by the organizing committee of Tirupati statutory conference comprising of all the papers received in the conference was also released in the executive meeting.
- Amended constitution of AIFUCTO and booklet in English on NEP written by General Secretary Dr. Arun Kumar was also released in the executive meeting.

Greetings from AIFUCTO.

May I draw your kind attention to the following facts:

- 1. In view of the Covid-19 pandemic, teachers all over India found it difficult to get selected for the Refresher and Orientation Courses. In view of the difficulties due to the pandemic, exemption may please be given to Refresher and Orientation Courses till December 2022.
- 2. Though there exist provisions in the official gazette published on 18th July 2018 regarding granting of advance Increment for Ph.D. and M.Phil. to teaching staff, this is not being granted since July 2018. This sad state of affairs was after a letter from MHRD that was issued in November 2017. We request you to kindly intervene and solve this long-standing issue.
- 3. As per UGC Regulations 2018, the Ph.D. degree is made mandatory qualification for the promotion of Associate Professor (Level 13A) and Professor (Level 14). The incumbent teachers those who are without PhD degree are greatly affected by this unwarranted condition.
 - While all the teachers are not given equal opportunity for pursuing PhD degree on various grounds, it is requested that the incumbent teachers, who have completed the specified years of service to move to the Level 13A or 14, may kindly be exempted from the condition. The privilege is requested to those teachers who don't have sufficient time to complete the degree.
- 4. Salary arrear pertaining to implementation of 7th Scheme for the period from January 2016 to March 2019 has not been released pending central share for the same. Efforts may please be taken to release the said amount.
- 5. The provision of Sabbatical Leave is provided in the UGC regulations 2018. The aim of this idea was to foster professional and academic growth, learning and development of new skills etc. However, the State Governments are not positive towards this idea. We request the UGC to issue directions to the State Governments recommending the same to enrich higher education.

- 6. The age of superannuation of University and College teachers as per the MHRD notification (5th UGC regulation) was 62, which was raised to 65 years in the 6th UGC regulations. This was continued in the 7th UGC regulations as well. Unfortunately, there is no uniformity with regard to age of superannuation and different states have set different retirement ages. Even at the state level, there exists a disparity in the retirement ages of University and College teachers. The retirement age of college teachers varies from 56 years (in Kerala) to 65 years (in Chandigarh). The retirement age for teachers in many Union Territories like Delhi, Pondicherry and Goa is also 65. Such a variation is indeed an injustice to the teaching community in higher education. It is often said that the states adopt UGC regulations in toto. However, this is not made applicable in the case age of superannuation. The qualifications for appointment and career advancement are the same for University and College teachers. In such a scenario, keeping the age of superannuation different is further an injustice to the teachers in Colleges. The rich experience gained by a teacher needs to be made available to the students at least till the age of superannuation as prescribed by UGC and this should be the same for University and College Teachers pan India. This will also help in overcoming the shortage of teachers. Thus, in a larger perspective this is an urgent need for the progress of higher education in India. Hence we humbly request you to intervene in this matter positively to enhance and equate the retirement age of teachers in Universities and Colleges.
- 7. We request the UGC to abstain itself from implementing the regressive recommendations of the National Education Policy 2020. We demand more discussions in this regard with all the stake holders and in particular the 'All India Federation of University and College Teachers Organisations' (AIFUCTO), for the welfare of the higher education system.

We wish to bring to your notice that the AIFUCTO has previously sent letters to draw the attention of UGC and request for a discussion on educational problems as well as our genuine long pending service matters. The National Executive Committee of AIFUCTO in its meeting held at Chennai on 31st August, 2022 has decided that if there is no positive response from UGC to hold discussion with AIFUCTO delegation and to fulfil the above demands, a three day continuous Dharna shall be organized before the UGC office in Delhi from 16th to 18th November, 2022.

Hence AIFUCTO requests your favourable response to hold discussion and to fulfil our just and long pending demands.



XVIII CONGRESS OF WFTU 6-8 MAY, 2022, ROME, ITALY

ROME DECLARATION

Qualifying with multiple unique features, the 18th Congress of the World Federation of Trade Unions (WFTU) held in the capital city of Rome, Italy on 6-8 May 2022 has been a historical international working class event.

Representing 93 countries, 430 registered delegates participated in the Congress. 330 (77%) participated physically while 100 (23%) participated virtually from all over the world.

In compliance with the decades old rich practice and in adherence to the principle of working class democracy as enunciated in the Constitution of WFTU, the Congress has democratically elected a Presidential Council (PC) in which new Cadres have been elected for the first time.

The PC has representation from 50 countries representing all the five Continents. The same percentages for the new Secretariat and the new Financial Control Committee are as follows: Secretariat countries: 10, FCC counties: 7.

The composition of the delegates in the Rome Congress of the WFTU shall be remembered for grass-root trade union cadres with spirit of working class courage, conviction, simplicity, sacrificing, and class-oriented militancy. The Rome Congress was truly internationalist, class-oriented, democratic, open, multi-color, workers' Congress. These are lessons learnt and enriched in course of the long seventy six years of class oriented revolutionary struggles conducted by the WFTU affiliates and cadres worldwide led by the leadership of WFTU against the barbarity of capitalism.

class struggle, local, regional, national or international, is part of the global system of the workers' struggle. Constructive self-criticism and criticism featured in number of speeches have greatly enriched the deliberations. This, after all, shows a genuine workers' characteristic that reminds us of the inevitable role of the Detachment and Vanguard in revolutionary overthrow of the capitalism under the leadership of working class.

The fighting working class led by WFTU carried out courageous battle despite multifarious odds and gave a resounding answer to those who would like to see a Congress that would not be worthy of the size and importance of the WFTU.

Also necessary to note that, the WFTU Congress took place in the background of a dangerous international geopolitical and economic development. The deep and deeper depth of the systemic crisis of capitalism, which even bourgeois analysis cannot hide, shows an even greater intensity of exploitation of the working class inflicting further impoverishment, shocking rise in unemployment and the capitalist class onslaught on the workers' achievements, democratic freedoms and trade union rights.

True to their capitalistic class dishonesty, the bourgeois class is trying to mislead the people with orchestrated campaign hiding the real cause of the crisis. They are projecting Coronavirus Pandemic as the sole cause of the crisis. The Pandemic may have contributed in the timing and depth of the crisis. But the basic cause lies in capitalist system itself. The real causes of this crisis must be traced in the laws of the capitalist mode of production, in the large over-accumulated capital that could not be recapitalized or reinvested, thus hitting hard the capitalist class in their unlimited profit greed.

Capitalist class Governments and the Agents of bourgeoisie in the US, EU and Japan are making major state interventions attempting to revive the capitalist economy by pursuing an expansionary Fiscal Policy. The truth is, however, that no capitalist maneuver can sustainably address the crisis. At best there can be totally temporary breathing space ultimately leading to a deeper crisis.

On the other hand, once again the burden of the crisis is being shifted to the shoulder of the workers. The people are called upon to pay for the new loans and to shoulder the burden of all the anti-labor, anti-people policies which designed to reduce wages, impose layoffs in bigger numbers and crush social security rights. In fact, in the beginning these measures come as temporary emergency measures but they become permanent later on. Shockingly, for the capitalist camp, however, the crisis is an opportunity to notoriously push forward their anti-worker schemes.

Take for example the issue of so-called "green growth", which is designed to impose financial burden the people on account of expensive electricity, so-called flexible employer-employee relationships, green indirect taxes and new burdens on peoples' families, in order for the state to support new profitable green investments of business tycoons.

Imperialist antagonisms between imperialist alliances and also between states within these alliances for control of markets, energy sources and transportation routes are intensifying creating danger of imperialist wars involving Eastern Mediterranean, Africa and Southeast Asia to the Arctic. In fact, a special place in these imperialist antagonisms is occupied by the Indo-Pacific region where the main sphere of interest of the imperialist alliances is shifted. The risk of a generalized imperialist war is deepening and expanding.

The recent war and developments in Ukraine show that Europe is not safe either. All those who believed that the wars were only taking place outside Europe are proved totally wrong. On the contrary, what is proving to be clear is that the causes of the wars lie in the overturn in the international balance of power, as formed in 1991 with the dissolution of the USSR and the overthrow of Socialism in the countries of Central and Eastern Europe.

Moreover, the arms race shows exactly this situation, with global military spending exceeding - for the first time in history - \$ 2 trillion in 2021. In fact, an indication of our times reveals the intensity of competition and military aggressiveness and the changes in the defense doctrines in a number of capitalist states (a typical example is

Germany a few years ago, more recently Japan). At the same time, NATO is aggressively conspiring to bring under its fold the countries which been described as "neutral" for decades, such as Sweden and Finland.

In fact, the relations of uneven interdependencies that characterize the imperialist system and govern the relations between all the capitalist states, are formed through a number of international and regional alliances, organizations and agreements that also indirectly reflect the correlation of power. In recent years, in addition to the most well- known organizations (e.g. UN, NATO, EU, OSCE, WTO, G7, G20), which are led by the US, new ones have emerged.

The wider changes that are taking place at the economic level reflect the changes in the web of the international imperialist groupings. Thus, notable is the US leadership considers the current composition of the Group of Seven most powerful capitalist states (USA, Japan, Canada, France, UK, Italy and Germany) are turning obsolete and that Australia, South Korea and India are being dragged into new anti-Chinese alliance. For example AUKUS consisting of Australia-UK-US; QUAD composed of USA-Japan-Australia and India.

At the same time, the US government, utilizing the massive tax reduction for the capitalist class, is calling on US monopolies in new technologies operating in China to abandon it or return to the US, while making efforts to prevent China's expansion through the "New Silk Road" and its investments in third world countries. Sino-US competition is also what will determine future developments, with both sides trying to strengthen their own alliances.

Taking into consideration the international and regional big picture and keeping in view the foregoing facts, figures and formulations captured on the basis of the objective socio-politico-economic situation prevailing in the world, WFTU calls upon the working class and the militant trade union movement throughout the world to strengthen trade union organization, to intensify militant struggles of the working class, to resist the class onslaught of capitalism, to expose and defeat the machinations of imperialist forces.

The WFTU Congress, after discussion and open democratic dialogue, resolves the following immediate Priority Tasks.

Going through the third decade of the 21st century and as we are about to celebrate WFTU's 80 years of life and action, the 18th Congress reaffirms the values of a class, democratic, internationalist and mass unionism with our tasks being:

- The preservation and continuous strengthening of the unity of WFTU lines, which is fundamental so that our organization can continue playing its role as the most consistent and steadfast defender of workers' rights.
- The safeguarding of the unity of the working class as a single, global, social class, in the struggle for social liberation from capitalist exploitation. In this struggle to overthrow capitalist slavery, the working class develops its broad social alliances with the peasants, the progressive intelligentsia and the self-employed.
- 3. The strengthening and deepening of the principles on which WFTU was founded upon, as a trade union organization that accepts and moves forward based on the principles of class struggle, democratic and trade union freedoms, for the defense of the right to organize and the right to strike. The WFTU follows and applies the values of democracy and direct contact with the workers, while respecting the operating principles of base trade unions.
- 4. The Right to Strike: WFTU recognizes the Right to Strike as a fundamental human right and is an essential part of Freedom of Association. The capitalist class at national, regional and international levels has taken an aggressive approach not only to violate this fundamental right but are actively trying to unarm workers and trade unions of this right. The WFTU will stand vehemently against these attacks and will defend the Right to Strike at all costs.
 - Internationalism and solidarity among all workers regardless of color, religion, gender, language and political preferences. In that, no employee and no sector can be left alone in its struggles and demands.
 - 6. Since its foundation, WFTU has always been an anti-imperialist trade union movement, defending the right of every people to decide for itself, freely and democratically, on its present and future. WFTU condemns imperialist wars and imperialist interventions. It stands against Racism, Fascism and Xenophobia.
 - 7. We promote in practice the equal participation of women and youth in the activities and operation of trade unions. We make sure they assume important positions of responsibility and we trust their role. - 8. We want class-oriented, democratic, mass unions that will function as schools for social struggles for the emancipation of the working class. We want them to work collectively, always turning towards the base and the common worker. We want them to have a long-lasting and unwavering front against bureaucracy, elitism, careerism and corruption.
- WFTU intervenes in international organizations in which it participates, promoting the positions of the class-oriented trade union movement and revealing the antilabor character of organizations that violate their very own principles and reasons on which they were founded.
- 10.The entire organization of WFTU is dedicated on a daily basis to a constant action for improving the living standards of the toiling masses ensuring better wages, secured employment, social insurance, culture and intellect. The satisfaction of the workers' CONTEMPORARY NEEDS is an ongoing goal for every country, sector, region and trade union.
- 11.Today, with all the technological progress and accumulated wealth, the standard for contemporary needs must always be set high. New technologies and digitization must be utilized for the improvement of the workers' life and not for the increase of profits. These contemporary needs, according to the way the class-oriented trade union movement understands them, unquestionably include the right to free health, decent housing, access to clean water, the right to safe, reliable and cheap public transport, and free public education for all children.

The Contemporary Struggle of the Working Class

- 12.The capitalist mode of production, while sinking into crisis with its own contradictions, permanently seeks ways to maintain its hegemony. Given that the essence of its survival is marked by the appropriation of the wealth produced by the working class, the burden of the crisis always falls on the working class when the system enters into crisis.
- 13. Therefore, apart from its recurrent drops in rate of profit, especially from the 1970s onwards and the crises that followed, especially that of 2008/2009, the system accelerated a set of changes in the way, how and where to produce. the new era in the world of work.

- 14.In addition, seeking to weaken political resistance to this anti-workers attack, they are making labor legislation more flexible and deregulating the role of trade union representation. Overall, despite the large mobilizations, the result of this current stage is the precariousness of work and the awareness of a considerable part of our class.
- 15.The World Federation of Trade Unions and its affiliated Unions should not underestimate this new situation; on the contrary, they must study and confront with tactics and appropriate means, in particular, with the strengthening of political training and union work at the base.

In this context, the 18th Congress of the WFTU approves the following priority objectives for the next period:

Income - Wages - Remuneration

 We support and demand unfettered collective bargaining and the signing of fair and just Collective Agreements for full-time, stable work, with dignified wages. Collective Agreements should govern every country and every sector, meeting the demands of the workers. For example and as a minimum requirement, the workers' income in every country must be at least twice as much as the poverty threshold.

A 35-hour working week with no reduction in salary

2. We are constantly fighting for a reduction in working hours and a simultaneous improvement in wages. WFTU's position is for a 35-hour, 5-day week which is immediately necessary and realistic. The next step should be a 7-hour, 4-day week of full-time employment, without reducing wages. According to the situation in its own country, each union should struggle to further improve working hours and guarantee decent wages. This is the only way in which the working class and all workers in general will receive a share of the wealth produced by labour and the profits yielding from the explosive development of technology and science in the production process.

WFTU strongly opposes part-time or undeclared work, labor slavery and lay-offs.

With the implementation of tele-work, flexible forms of employment are further promoted, working hours are increased and stable and permanent work with rights is being challenged. We propose to develop a broad campaign for a 35-hour working day with no reduction in salary and launch it next October 03, 2022.

Social Security

We demand public social security and pension for everyone, so that all workers in all sectors can enjoy full rights and insurance coverage. Undeclared and uninsured work constitutes a "casus belli" for the class-oriented trade union movement.

High Prices - Unemployment - Privatization

4. These are also the results of capitalist barbarity of the 'enemies' of the trade union movement and the workers. High prices affect poor people, unemployment is "the fifth column" within trade unions, and privatizations present monopolies and multinational companies the opportunity to lay off workers and attack their vested rights.

Privatizations lead to the selloff of public wealth and give a great opportunity to the monopolies and multinational companies to lay off workers, to attack their rights and gains and to deprive workers of free and universal access to social goods. The fight against high prices, unemployment and privatizations must be high on the priority agenda of WFTU's day to day struggles.

Immigrants - Refugees

5. Imperialist wars create refugees and immigrants. The exploitation of the wealth of the Third World breeds poverty and immigration. One of the main priorities of the international militant trade union movement has always been the write-off of the foreign debt of Third World countries. At the same time, we defend the lives and rights of immigrants and refugees. We strongly oppose and fight racist and neofascist phenomena. For WFTU, the working class is united as a class.

Child Labor - Working during Pregnancy

 Children should be at school, playing with their peers. Child labor should be banned in practice – not just in words. For pregnant women, the international rules governing maternity leave, lighter work and banning lay-offs, should be implemented.

7. Health and safety at the workplace are matters of great importance for WFTU, as the workers must return to their homes and families safe and sound. We focus on the establishment and operation of health and safety committees in the workplace. Addressing the environmental crisis is also of great importance to WFTU, as we believe that it is caused by the ruthless speculative action of monopolies and multinational cartels. Poor people are drowning, burned and killed because of the consequences of this crisis: floods, cold weather, fires, and earthquakes.

An immediate dissolution of NATO

- WFTU opposes the waste of resources and money for military purposes. It also
 opposes the use of nuclear energy for military purposes and calls for an immediate
 dissolution of NATO.
- We do not agree with the exclusions, discriminations, embargoes and sanctions imposed by the US, NATO and the EU against various countries, as they negatively impact the standard of living of low-income families, workers and poor, small farmers

International Action Day of Trade Unions for Peace

- 10.The WFTU Congress declares the 1st of September be observed as 'International Action Day' of all trade unions for Peace. It is to recall that on 1st September 1939, Nazi Germany started the World War II.
- 11.Today again we are witnessing with serious concern the re-emergence of neo-Fascist and neo-Nazi forces poising real threat to the working class. It is imperative and need of the hour to mobilize peace loving people against imperialist war game for promoting and protecting peace. In this framework, the WFTU, its members and friends also celebrate and honor the 9th of May every year as the great day that marks the victory of the Peoples; the defeat of Hitler and the end of World War II.

A democratic and collective leadership system

12. The WFTU and all of its leading bodies function in a democratic and collective way; the Presidential Council, the TUIs, the Regional Offices, the Committees of Women, Youth, the Legal Committee etc coordinate their actions and initiatives in order to promote the workers' struggles and follow the central directions of the WFTU. The Regional Offices and the TUIs can cooperate and coordinate their action

Political cadres committed to the struggle

13.WFTU is always alert and alive that we are judged by people for our action and effectiveness. All of our leading bodies, our cadres, all of us are watched by our class. We are committed without any compromise to fight for the cause of workers. Each cadre is being judged and tested primarily within his/her own country and sector. It is there that he or she will be tested whether he or she points out, promotes and supports the directions, positions and glorious banners of the WFTU.

Create an International Committee for Promotion & Protection of Trade Union Rights & Freedoms

- 14.Unable to rescue itself from the iron clutch of ever deepening systemic crisis of capitalism, the capitalist class has resorted to barbaric attack on the working class and trade union movement. They are promoting precarious employment, depriving job security, worsening working conditions and demolishing the rights of the workers, particularly Right to Organise, Right to Collective Bargaining and Right to Strike Action.
- 15. The monopolies, multinational companies and governments of the capitalist world utilize new technologies to restrict trade union formation and their free functioning as well as the democratic and individual freedoms of workers in society and in workplaces.
- 16.Nowadays technology driven onslaught of anti-worker surveillance and restrictions on free trade union and social action are added to the age old antitrade union and anti-democratic cruel and violent repression by employers supplemented by state authoritarianism that even goes to the extent of organized murders of trade unionists.
- 17.The International Committee for the protection of trade union and democratic freedoms will gather evidence and present memorandums to International Organizations and will support the relevant initiatives of the leading bodies of the WFTU. It will also cooperate with the WFTU Legal Committee.
- 18.On the other hand, most employers do not apply all the necessary health and safety measures in the workplaces since they consider the health and safety of

workers as a cost and that leads to occupational "accidents". The ILO estimates that some 2.3 million women and men around the world succumb to work-related accidents or diseases every year; this corresponds to over 6000 deaths every single day.

19.Worldwide, there are around 340 million occupational accidents and 160 million victims of work-related illnesses annually. The protection of workers inside the workplaces will also be among the tasks of the International Committee.

WFTU Funding

20. The WFTU is based on the fees of its affiliates and the support of its friends. It has no other resources. For this reason, the Congress calls on all affiliated organizations to pay their fees. The financial support strengthens the financial self-reliance and the organizational development of the WFTU.

An integrated WFTU communication system

- 21. The vast majority of media are controlled by multinational and monopoly interests. They are instruments and mechanisms of propaganda against the interests of workers and peoples. The militant unions must reveal the propaganda role of these media and at the same time find ways to get the truth and the real facts to the workers, taking advantage of all the possibilities of technology to break the monopoly of multinationals in information.
- We decide that the WFTU Head Office should remain in Athens and that the location of the WFTU European Regional Office (EUROF) should be moved from Cyprus, where it was until now, to Italy.
